Description

Looks for CRC tumor-associated DNA markers and hidden human blood in stool

Looks for hidden human blood in the stool

Test Instructions & Process

- Exact Sciences (ES) will mail patients their home-based kit
- Patients provide ENTIRE bowel movement
- Patients mail sample to ES
 - If sample not returned,
 ES contacts patients
- ES returns results to clinic only via fax or EHR
- Patient receives home-based kit at clinic or by mail
- Patient provides sample via kit wand
- Patient either brings kit into clinic or mails pre-paid envelope to laboratory
- Patient follow-up and result notification varies by health system

Medication and Dietary Restrictions

If the test result is positive for either Cologuard or FIT, a follow-up colonoscopy should be scheduled
